Meet the Principals

Great schools happen when an outstanding principal puts together an excellent academic program and an outstanding staff. The principals of the two charter schools at Harding have

certainly fulfilled this paradigm.

Last year a new principal was appointed at Harding Charter Prep when Carole Kelly resigned to join her husband who took a new job out of state. After a nationwide search the board found the perfect candidate right in the halls of HCP. Justin Hunt was then the vice principal of HCP. Mr. Hunt is an Oklahoma native and grew up in Enid, OK. He received his B.S. degree in Math Education from Northwestern Oklahoma State University in Alva in 2006 and has teaching certificates in intermediate mathematics and advanced mathematics. Mr. Hunt began his teaching career in Newkirk, OK. While there he taught mathematics and served as head baseball coach in addition to completing his Master's degree in Education Administration at Oklahoma State University, Weatherford.

In his first two years at HCP, Mr. Hunt was Assistant Principal, Director of Saturday School, Director of Summer School and Building Test Coordinator. It is little wonder that he was se-

lected to be Principal of HCP in 2012.

Justin goals for HCP are to be at or above last year's ranking and to maintaining the high test scores that HCP students have achieved. In addition, he hopes to promote an attitude of life-long-learning within the student population and to insure the safety of the student population.

Justin is married to Laverne, OK native Shailaina Hunt. They have one three year old son, Braedyn. In his leisure time he enjoys spending time with his family and watching sports. He is a fan of OU, OSU, the Saint

Louis Cardinals and the Oklahoma City Thunder.

An accomplished teacher and administrator, Dr. Sherry Rowan joined HFAA as principal in 2006. She has overseen the school from near it's beginning and has built it to a point

Outstanding Alum-Bob Vernon, '64

Bob Vernon's love of teaching started during his senior year at Harding. In his 43rd year as an educator, he first felt the draw to teach while tutoring students in 1965. Bob graduated from Yale in 1969 with a B.S. in history. Although he contemplated enrolling in law school that summer, he learned about Teacher Corp, a program established to improve elementary and secondary education in low income areas. Bob seized the opportunity to teach and enrolled immediately.

That same fall, Bob joined the Air National Guard, splitting his time between teaching and the reserves. In 1971, Bob left Teacher Corps with a master's degree in education from the University of Oklahoma and a deepened desire to teach. He taught a few years in Norman, followed by a year immersed in a Ph.D.

program at Stanford University. It was during his time at Stanford that he realized his ultimate career goal was to have his own school, not to spend his professional time in academia.

Bob saw a potential to grow Westminster school. He wanted to head development of a middle division at Westminster. That fall, Bob began teaching fifth and sixth graders at Westminster. He started to lay the groundwork for the middle school, which opened in 1978. In 1992, Bob was appointed head of school, the position he still holds.

Bob has served as a trustee or board member of the Crown Heights-Edgemere Heights Neighborhood Association and the Oklahoma School of Science and Math, but most of his time has been devoted to Westminster School. In addition

to work, he tries to exercise daily and keeps up with current events and politics. He has been happily married for nearly 43 years to Lissa. They have two children and three grandchildren.

"As I reflect on my career and time at Westminster School, I'm most proud of my students and the community we've created," Bob says. "I'm more proud of what they have accomplished than anything I've done. I've been very fortunate and love what I do."
